1. Objective and scope of the mission

In follow-up to previous support and co-operation, MEPA Waste Management Department had requested urgent exchange and capacity-building on implementation issues related to **Extended Producer Responsibility** on the currently prepared **regulations on packaging and End-of-Life-Vehicles**.

From side of the international expert team, one specific focus was the requirement for nation-wide coverage of EPR systems, following the successful Austrian practice adapted to the actual situation in Georgia.

Since Georgia is now a EU candidate country, also the relevant EC Decisions on reporting for specific waste streams were introduced.

Three days of discussions and capacity-building mainly with the team of the Waste Management Department at MEPA, and including experts of the EU-funded Technical Assistance project assisting with calculations for the End of Life Vehicles Regulation.

4. Main results of the mission

4.1. Packaging and Packaging Waste

The main features of the Austrian system and derived recommendations for the Georgian packaging regulation were presented by the international experts. Central element for the joint work on flipcharts was a comparative table of the main features of the Austrian system and recommendations for Georgia (see annex), as well as a table with real figures from Belgium and Austria for calculating national targets based on data from commercial and household packaging.

The discussion with MEPA staff focused on: division of household and commercial packaging system, nationwide and area area-wide system in Georgia, specific targets per commercial and household packaging, uniform tariff and collection categories, level





playing field for packaging EPR. On all issues understanding of MEPA staff could be increased.

One important issue for Georgia is to consider options for differentiating the approach for the capital region Tbilisi and other regions of the country, taking into account the planned investment into a Mechanical-Biological Treatment installation for the capital city. Following experience from advanced EU Member States, such investment needs careful planning and may risk to disturb the development of separate collection of household packaging in line with the ambitious minimum recycling targets set by EU which will be gradually adopted by EU candidate country Georgia.

4.2. End-of-Live Vehicles

Regarding the End of Live Vehicles Regulation, discussion on the recommendations made after review of the draft EoLV regulation, including with the representatives of the EUfunded Technical Assistance project on their tool for calculation of "advanced recycling fee" for End of Life Vehicles.

The international experts proposed an alternative more comprehensive tool which was welcomed by MEPA and discussed in detail. Final result of this discussion was a joint calculation of the "close-to-real level advanced recycling fee" taking into account the specific situation of EoLV in Georgia.
